MCMF DISTRIBUTED 69,400 LBS. OF FOOD AND 3,035 MEALS

RAMDAN REFUGEE PROJECT- April 24 to May 8, 2020

MCMF distributed 14,700 lbs of food to 210 refugee families new to the area and to families whose members had lost jobs due to the COVID-19 crisis. This project served 1,000 refugees in Prince Georges, Baltimore, and Montgomery County. Food packages contained rice, pasta, oil, dates, bread, sugar, tea, onions, dry lentils, and other non-perishable goods.

MCMF SCHOOL FEEDING PROJECT - May 1st, May 26th, 2020

MCMF collaborated with MCPS to provide food to low income families in predominantly African American and Hispanic neighborhoods. The project distributed about 25,900 lbs of food to 600 families in MCPS school districts. This included 12,000 lbs of non-perishable food and 2,500 lbs of fresh produce to Green Castle Elementary School; 8,000 lbs of non-perishable food, 2,500 lbs of fresh produce and 200 dozen eggs to the Takoma Park Middle School cluster; and 900 lbs of food, including bread, eggs and fresh milk to Gaithersburg Elementary School.

FOOD PANTRY

The monthly food pantry distributed 23,100 lbs of non-perishables and perishables to 330 families (1188 individuals). MCMF food pantry also started an ongoing emergency food pantry program to serve families in need in Montgomery County. This program serves families on a daily basis.


MCMF, in partnership with Educare, provided 140 boxes of food to Montgomery County residents living in Silver Spring and Takoma Park. The donation included 5,700 lbs. of non-perishables and perishable food. MCMF also donated 600 lbs of food to 20 Hispanic families in collaboration with the Pentecostal Church.

MCMF, in collaboration with the City of Gaithersburg, served 315 packaged breakfast meals to shelterless people in Montgomery County.





MCMF HEALTH CARE WORKERS, POLICE AND FIRE AND RESCUE APPRECIATION MONTH

MCMF recognizes our heroes fighting in the frontline of the COVID-19 pandemic. We served 200 meals to Holy Cross Hospital, Adventist Hospital in Silver Spring, and Shady Grove Hospital; and to the Gaithersburg and Rockville Police and Fire and Rescue Departments.

MCMF Women Empowerment Group volunteers stitched 400 masks for area hospitals and refugees, and donated to Black Rock Center for Arts to distribute to low income families.

MLK DAY OF SERVICE

The MCMF Youth Program Participated in the MLK day of Service at the Bethesda Convention Center on Jan 20, 2020. The project was coordinated by Amina Rashid, Mrs. Nadia Choudry, Cyrus and Shoaib Choudry, and volunteers. Members of our youth program decorated 32 tote bags with rainbows for the NIH children's Inn.





TECH WORKSHOPS

MCMF and the Youth Tech Club, led by Fadil Abdullah Shaikh and team, held 8 live coding sessions at the MCMF office and 20 virtual sessions that benefitted 25 students in each session. Two classes (in Python and Scratch) were held simultaneously. Our MCMF youth group also held a Robotics Workshop for 14 students on February 17, 2020. The class was coordinated by Anum Khan.





PUBLIC SPEAKING WORKSHOP

The MCMF Youth Program organized a virtual public speaking seminar on June 22, 2020. The program was conducted by Mr. Umar Hameed, the CEO of No Limit Selling. The hour and a half interactive webinar had 24 attendees (parents and students) and focused on developing public speaking strategies, presentation skills to address specific audiences, speaking topics, and techniques for becoming a more engaging, memorable, and effective speaker. Most of the participants rated the webinar as 5 on a 5-point scale.

ZAKAT COMMITTEE

The Zakat Committee donated \$4,000 for rental assistance, clothing, and other essentials to refugees.
